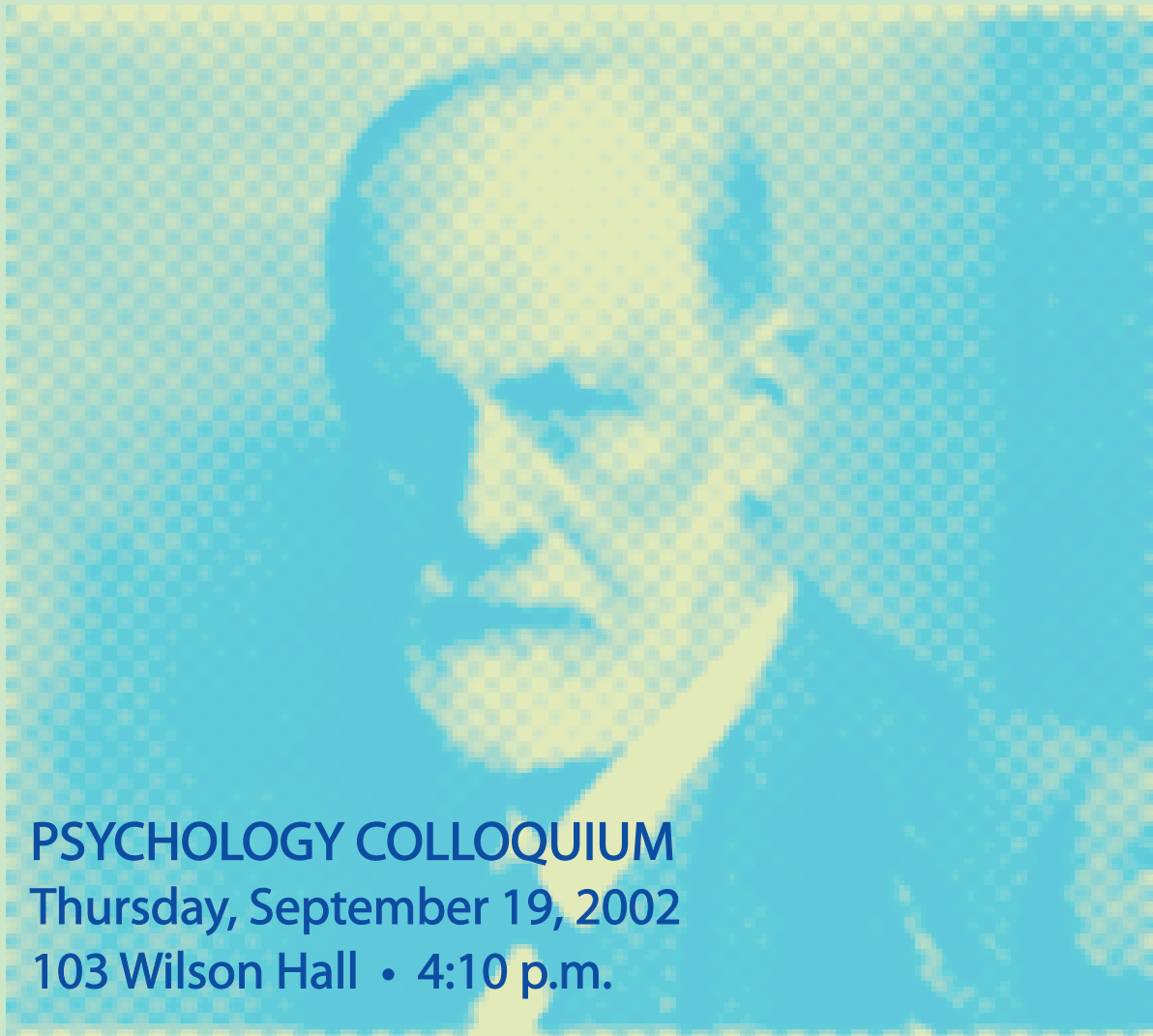

## Freud: First Cognitive Neuroscientist?

In 1895, Freud wrote a manuscript in which he developed a neural model of many brain functions, including memory and dreaming. In fact, his memory model was based on synaptic modification and almost foreshadowed the Hebb synapse of 1949. Although the manuscript was never published in Freud's lifetime, it suggests that he was in fact devoted to developing a neuroscience of higher cognitive functions.
